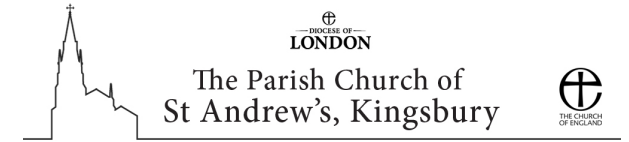

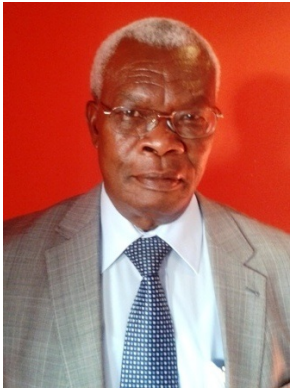

Joe loved St Andrew's, where he was a very faithful worshipper and churchwarden for many years. As churchwarden, he served priest and people tirelessly until his untimely death in March 2017, not only managing one of London's finest historical churches, and its other buildings, but also in his care for parishioners, past and present, near and far. St Andrew's was at the very heart of Joe's life, where he loved, first and foremost, to worship Almighty God.

Following his sudden death, the parish wishes to create a lasting memorial to mark Joe's faithful and dedicated service, and the strong leadership he showed a few years ago when the parish was without a full-time priest.

Joe was very proud of the fine and unique history of St Andrew's and always loved to share the beauty of the church with those who called in on the off-chance or through other opportunities offered by services or events in the church. So, the Parochial Church Council feel it would be a fitting memorial to replace and glaze the inner doors, in memory of a man who was so keen to share the beauty of St Andrew's and did so much towards its upkeep.

May he rest in peace!



The west doors are the principal entrance to the church and are central to the impressive front façade, along with its majestic spire, which can be seen as a prominent landmark for miles around. The outer doors are in heavy oak and when closed they are integral to the character of the façade. As these doors are currently more often closed than they are open, passers-by are prevented from seeing the beautiful interior with its many striking features. So to open up the view, it is intended to install new oak inner doors with clear glazed panels to enable people to see inside the church when the main doors are opened each day. These doors, which will be inscribed in memory of Joe, will greatly enhance the accessibility of the church that both he and we love so much.
