#### The Gloria

#### Then is sung:

The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7 'Behold my servant, in whom my soul delights."

At the end of the homily a brief silence is kept for recollection.

#### Presentation of the Candidates

#### <u>ALL STAND</u>

#### The Priest addresses the whole congregation:

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome these candidates and uphold them in their life in Christ?

#### With the help of God, we will.

The congregation SITS, the candidates REMAIN STANDING.

The Decision

The Priest addresses the parents and Godparents of the candidates for baptism and the adult candidate:

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? *Candidates:* I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? *Candidates:* I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour? *Candidates:* I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? *Candidates:* I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord? *Candidates:* I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life? *Candidates:* I come to Christ.

# Signing with the Cross

The Priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the candidates for baptism saying:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross. Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

#### The Priest then continues saying:

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.** 

<u>STAND</u> as the Priest and the candidates for baptism gather at the baptismal font.

## The Blessing of the Water

#### The Priest says:

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

# Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus. He was baptized in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love. He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him. Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptized in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever. **Amen.** 

# Profession of Faith

#### The Priest addresses the congregation:

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

#### Do you believe and trust in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ? I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven; he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

# The Baptism

The Priest asks the candidate's for their Christian name(s) and then pours water on the candidate three times, saying:

Varzi Michael & Soheil Martin, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

# The Sign of the Cross

The Priest anoints the candidate's head with the sacred oil of Chrism, saying:

Varzi Michael & Soheil Martin, may God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. **Amen.** 

# Giving of a Lighted Candle

The Priest gives the newly baptised a lighted candle, lit from the paschal candle, and says:

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light. You have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life. **Shine as a light in the world** 

# to the glory of God the Father.

Everyone returns to their seats.

Varzi Michael & Soheil Martin, there is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

The newly baptised are greeted with applause.

## The Eucharistic Prayer

The Priest sings:

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right and just.

The Priest continues with the Preface, praising God, and then all sing:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts.Heaven and earth are full of your glory.Hosanna in the highest.Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.Hosanna in the highest.

The Priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer.

At the elevation of the Host and the Chalice, the people acclaim: **My Lord and my God.** 

After the words of Consecration, the Priest sings:

#### The mystery of faith: We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

At the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer the people sing: **Amen.** 

# The Communion Rite

The Lord's Prayer

#### The Priest sings:

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.



# A DAY ON HAND REFLEXOLOGY FOR SELF HELP



Reflexology is a very ancient therapy. It was rediscovered by Dr Fitzgerald, an ear, nose and throat specialist. He discovered by pressing specific points on the hands or feet, anaesthesia occurred in specific parts of the body. These points were then mapped on the hands and feet by Eunice Ingham, one of his students. By working these points or reflexes on our own hands, on a regular basis we are able to keep our bodies in optimum health.

This day's workshop will explain the pressure techniques used and the reflex points related to specific parts of the human body. This workshop is for attendees to work only on their hands and there will be practical work throughout the day, so it is important you have short fingernails!
