The absolution is given by the Priest:

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. **Amen.**

The Gloria

Then is sung:

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.

At that time: There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'

Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding seventy or one hundred litres. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, 'Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast.' So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now.'

This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

At the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer the people sing: **Amen.**

A DAY ON HAND REFLEXOLOGY FOR SELF HELP

given by Pauline Turgoose who is a qualified reflexologist, yoga instructor and colour therapist. She is a member of the British Reflexology Association and is associated with the Complementary Medical Association.

Reflexology is a very ancient therapy. It was rediscovered by Dr Fitzgerald, an ear, nose and throat specialist. He discovered by pressing specific points on the hands or feet, anaesthesia occurred in specific parts of the body. These points were then mapped on the hands and feet by Eunice Ingham, one of his students. By working these points or reflexes on our own hands, on a regular basis we are able to keep our bodies in optimum health.

This day's workshop will explain the pressure techniques used and the reflex points related to specific parts of the human body. This workshop is for attendees to work only on their hands and there will be practical work throughout the day, so it is important you have short fingernails!
