The Introductory Rites

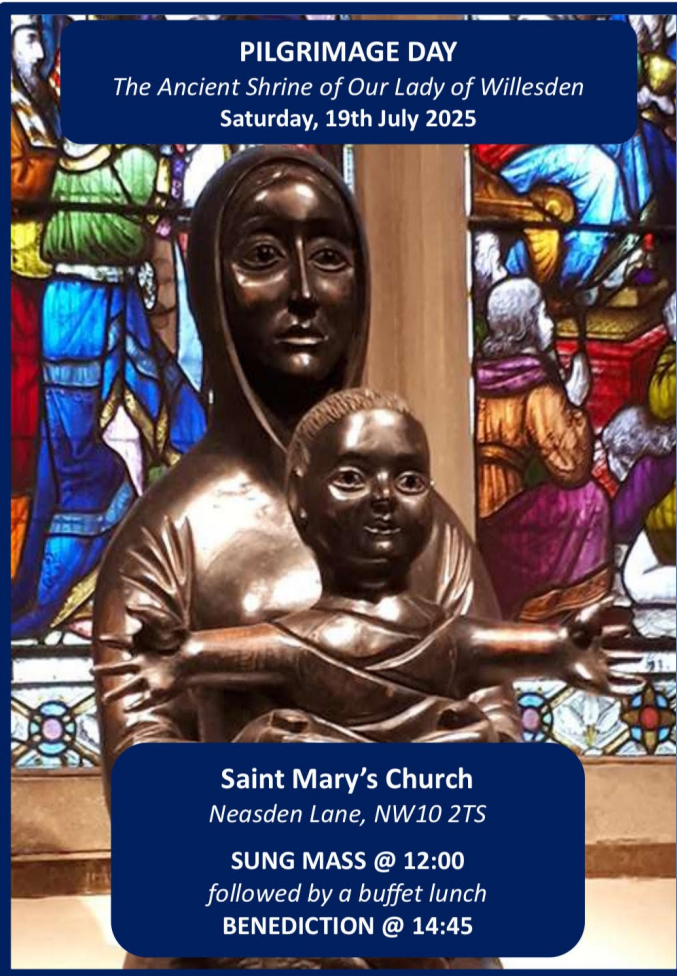

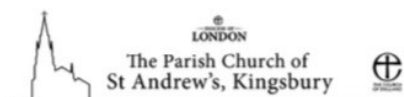
